" In this September, I was commissioned by Carnegie Hall to write a new chamber work for a Weill Music Institute Professional Training Workshop, which Yo-Yo Ma and the Silk Road Ensemble lead. The work needed indigenous Silk



Road instruments, varying combinations of Western strings and percussion. They presented the world premieres in four performances in Zankel Hall. The success of these performances made Yo-Yo Ma and the Silk Road Ensemble decide to take my piece on their upcoming tour in Spring 2007!

I got another offer from Carnegie, which works with Osvaldo Golijov and soprano Dawn Upshow. The work will be out in April 2007! "

### David Rowden - PMF2005, 2006, clarinet

" I have recently founded the Sydney Omega Ensemble (SOE) on my return to Australia after PMF 2005 and four years at the Royal Academy of Music in London. I was really inspired to start the SOE after working with Daniel Matsukawa as part of



the chamber music program at PMF. Now I work for the ensemble as artistic director, creating interesting and diverse programmes for our performances, and liaise with the artists performing with the ensemble. It is a very rewarding role.
